Befitting thoughts of flourishing gardens and prestige emerge when Jadescape is mentioned – apt images for a development so picturesque.

A joint collaboration with Tange Associates, this condominium at Shunfu reflects the same tranquility of nearby nature parks MacRitchie Reservoir and Bishan Park. Situated in the middle of a cluster of matured estates, Jadescape takes pride of place as a prominent residence for the modern family.

Jadescape offers aspects of healthy living and wellness, reflecting the abundance nature around the development.

The site proved challenging with its uneven terrain. Nonetheless, the arrangement of the residential towers, sited in verdant landscaping, ensures breathtaking views from every aspect. The towers are also positioned to mitigate sun exposure and optimise natural ventilation. In turn, this creates unique nooks throughout the estate with a diversity of moods.

The building forms are intended to beautify the skyline, hence the edge profiles of each building were made identical in height, for iteration, and also to break down the building masses, providing added visual definition.

Drawing upon oriental aesthetics, Jadescape's timber-resembling cladding, frames and lattice screens soften the urban building façade.

The development features rich greenery and water features, including amenities such as a gym, lounge, an infinity pool, an island deck and a sky terrace.

Of the various apartment sizes available (including two penthouses), one stands

to appeal to a growing demographic in Singapore and most of Asia: the ageing population. The Special Gold Standard Room layout features handrails around the apartment, non-slip tiles, ramps, emergency alarms, inconspicuous lighting and accents, and low-tilt/see-through cabinets for easy access. Think of it as a premium way to retire, affording peace of mind.

With regards to sustainability, lightweight concrete panels and low VOC emitting paint were utilised, reducing energy consumption. Motion sensor lights ensure energy savings are maximised, while naturally ventilated corridors and common areas promote environmental conservation.

The American International Hospital (AIH) is one of the first hospitals in Vietnam to be designed and operated in adherence with world-class standards. Located in An Phu Urban Area, District 2, a fast developing section of Ho Chi Minh City, it holds 120 beds over 10 storeys, and is equipped with advanced medical facilities that supersede the surrounding hospitals.

One of its main focuses is research and collaborations with other reputable American hospitals.

Responding to the needs of Asia's upcoming Medical Tourism market, AIH combines the assurance of quality healthcare with a holiday-like ambience that allows for convalescence. This market is set to grow at a rate of 25% per annum for the next 10 years.

The tailored interiors provided by ONG&ONG fuse quality medical care with a premium, hotel-like environment. The comfortable spaces have a positive effect on the psychology of patients, enhancing healing and promoting recovery. 

This elegant residential development comprises three towers with a total of 816 residential apartments, complemented by lifestyle retail shops and state-of-the-art recreational facilities below.

The car park podium levels break the monotony of the massing's vertical lines, presenting the onlooker with a visually appealing façade.

A wide selection of apartment types and layouts appeal to different market segments, with most units overlooking the central landscaped park with expansive pools and forested greens.



While the development employs clean architectural lines with subtle colours to create a sleek appearance, the green features soften the modernity of its walls with carefully manicured creepers and plants. Ranging from cascading sky gardens to pocket gardens, Greenfield Residence reflects sustainability while also providing luxe living.

The posh internal concourse drop-off porch offers additional privacy and security to the residents, while conveniently offering an area to host activities safely sheltered from the hindrance of weather.

A full suite of amenities within the development further boosts the resort style living experience. There is an Aquatic Cove for water activities, a Central Green

Park for nature lovers, an Energetic Corridor for active individuals and the Residential Facilities that include a floating gymnasium, yoga studio and even a library.

Nestled within a prime location in the heart of Bangkok at Sukhumvit 16, is The Collection. Supported by ONG&ONG's Interior Design team and IMMORTAL, the development is a dream come true for the well-heeled coterie, with a classy, well-furnished 40-unit Hotel Tower and a 443-unit Residence Tower.

IMMORTAL crafted the messaging strategy, shifting the traditional focus of marketing from the development itself to paying due attention to the target audience. This gave rise to four personality profiles for which

the luxury development held most appeal: The Trendsetter, The Traveller, The Thinker, and The Diva – glorified characters that the interior design team predicated the units, facilities and show gallery upon.

World-class materials were utilised, with beadblasted stainless steel, walnut laminate walls, brass finishes and rose gold splashes. A rose gold spiral staircase (particularly picturesque), was placed in the Sky Lounge, while the extravagant Powder Room contains several full gold additions.

Black and grey marble tiled flooring was chosen for the public areas, while chevron-styled aged oak timber floors were selected for a majority of the units.

Vertical lines inspired the interiors, with a posh and minimalist approach to the residence and hotel lobbies featuring elegant touches of walnut finish and black and grey marble flooring.

The amenities are extensive, including a residents' lounge, gym, a private meeting room, co-kitchen space, library lounge and a swimming pool.

But the true gem of the facilities is the Sky level, which features a bar, jogging route, garden and a Sky lounge. A place to revel in both the views and company, the lounge feature glittering chandeliers, floor-to-ceiling windows, black marble bar tops and plush furniture.

A timeless and immaculate sensibility makes The Collection not just a place to come home to, but an embrace of life's finer things, without compromise.





37FC-House

Secluded within an exclusive residential pocket, this home was designed for a multi-generational family. It maximises the plot boundaries, and this resulted in a palatial four-storey structure, complete with an attic and basement. Granite tiles line the driveway area, in contrast to the textured, fair-faced concrete and floor-length mirror glass window that dominates the front façade. The usage of teak warms the house tastefully, creating a homely ambience.

Moving the service areas to the front of the house (for more spatial allowance), allows the well-equipped kitchen to be at the back end of the home, coloured with

deep grey finishes along with a black stone island countertop for culinary exploits. Hand-selected furniture decorates the living room, flowing towards a verdant garden at the rear of the house. Glass panelling extends lengthwise across the ground floor, showcasing the greenery that adorns the outer edge of the home, forming a subtle boundary separating the new home from neighbours on either sides. Greenery is also incorporated into the various levels of the house, adding a taste of nature on each level.


The ground floor living room boasts polished concrete, featuring a system

of retractable floor-to-ceiling glass windows leading to the backyard garden and bluish sukabumi-tiled lap pool.

The second floor, 50 percent larger than the ground volume, is constructed as a rectangular volume of textured fair-face concrete, with bedrooms facing an unobstructed view of the street and garden. The master bedroom comes complete with a walk-in-wardrobe and an expansive master bathroom, while two junior suites overlook the backyard garden and pool area.

A sculptural black steel staircase joins the four floors of the home, with a teak strip motif spanning the length of the aligning wall. The stairwell leads to the basement which houses a state-of-the-art multimedia room, where light from the swimming pool flows into the subterranean space through a glass port. The top of the staircase opens up to an attic that also doubles as a guest bedroom, where space allocated for greenery and a water feature adds life.

37FC-House boasts solar panning that reduces energy consumption, and nighttime lighting programmed with a multi-setting timer. These measures contribute to almost 30% overall energy savings within the home. The homeowner was also supplied with a mobile application for an added measure of control, allowing him to remotely adjust home settings for more peace of mind.





Tekka Place

Singapore's Little India houses streets chock full of diverse cultures, and are visited by local shoppers and tourists alike. With Tekka Place located at the top of Serangoon Road, it was vital for the architecture to capture the soul of the precinct. The development comprises a 10-storey main block, a seven-storey annex block with a rooftop deck, serviced residences and five levels of parking.

Previously known as The Verge Mall, this integrated development is envisaged to deliver an illuminating retail experience, underscored by its positioning as the gateway to Little India.



Cultural references such as the lotus petal (a prevalent motif in Indian culture) are utilised as motifs on the façade screens, in a rhythmic pattern to represent Little India's shophouses with open and closed louvered windows.

The spatial experience continues within the building, extending the vibrant and bustling streetscape into the commercial podium. An internal street bisects the podium, connecting Serangoon Road to Clive Street through Tekka Place. Tekka Place is poised to "provide a unique space to live, dine, entertain or simply relax and enjoy the vitality of Little India," said Mr Peter Ow,

Property Director of Lum Chang and spokesperson of the joint venture. To further embrace the area's rich culture, dedicated spaces are in the pipeline to host relevant arts events.

The mall spans 70,000 sq ft of retail space encompassing 80 units spread across the basement and first two floors of the main block. F&B choices with views of the city will be perched on the outdoor rooftop area.

Occupying the upper floors of the main block is Citadines Rochor, a 320-unit serviced residence with studio and one-bedroom units. Facilities include a lounge, gym, launderette and swimming pool. Designed as a vertical neighbourhood, the block is split into two smaller massings, with verdant greenery softening the form, in parallel with the streets below. Tekka Place is slated for completion in late 2019.

Located on a knoll off River Valley Road, near the Singapore River, is 8 St Thomas. Breathing life into the architecture and landscape with water features and verdure, it is a balance of nature and urbanity.

Designed by DP Architects as an uber-condominium, the architecture was inspired by the works of world-renowned Piet Mondrian, whose principles in Neoplasticism sought to help humanity achieve perfection and anthroposophy.

These principles inspired the landscape concept of "The River Valley", utilising natural features to improve the overall wellbeing of the residents in both body and mind.

The development is ensconced within a perimeter of vertical strata lining, mimicking a canyon wall and accentuating the main feature – a curved grand green wall spanning more than 50m in width that imparts a sense of wonder.

A walkway leads from the drop-off area to the main amenities within the Water Court, concealed by a unique back-to-back feature wall of natural green facing the lap pool and woven brass facing the porte-cochère.

The landscape design imitates a cerulean river valley network with water cascading from the hillside into a series of recreational lagoons.

The amenities within the Water Court include an impressive pool network designed to look like a single water body, though with different elevations and sizes: there is a 40-metre lap pool, a lounge pool, a continental deck for sun tanning and a family-sized hot tub. The children's pool, located next to the clubhouse, is in a separate lagoon, and is livened up with water playground fixtures to encourage activity.

Sports facilities include tennis courts, fitness stations and a looped footpath on the roof terrace that serves as a jogging track overlooking the amenities.

In the heart of Little India sits a secret gem – Farrer Square, a 20-storey mixed development built to impress. It comprises a 12-storey hotel operated by Park Hotel group and another eight storeys of offices (specifically for medical suites), sitting on three floors of shops and a multi-storey car park.

A view of the lap pool sees a 1.8m high, curved waterwall, positioned to screen the sight of unattractive adjacent buildings whilst the sky terrace on the Rangoon Road side doubles up as the alfresco section for all-day dining amidst the greenery.

At the pool deck, additional event space comes in the form of two pavilions – an intimate one floating over the water, and a larger one at the opposite end to cater for events.

On the 13th storey, an L-shaped sky terrace is offered as a green lung for hotel guests to enjoy a nightcap while taking in the iconic Singapore city skyline.

The project's surrounding verdure creates a calming, intriguing exterior, with the greenery extending vertically.

The fifth storey has recreational activities for guests to reinvigorate themselves with spa seats, spa beds or a calming swim. On this floor, the all-day dining sits at the heart of the massing, enjoying the hotel with the office (medical suites) tower.

SCA Design has once again been tasked to design Manulife's newly acquired building Manulife Tower. With IMMORTAL's Environmental Wayfinding solutions, they were appointed to realise Manulife's workspace and upgrade the building for a fresh approach, complemented with wayfinding solutions.

Manulife envisioned an office that would allow employees to feel that they are "living the brand" and to achieve this, focus group workshops and online surveys were conducted to translate their vision. This process empowered employees to decide on their preferred working environment.

The new Manulife office, spanning over 100,000 sqft, illustrates the allocation of spatial usage to improve collaboration between employees, expressing

transparency with clients while embracing the evolving future strategy of the brand.

Upon entering the office, visitors will be greeted by a warm and inviting reception, featuring a harmony of marble and timber, while a nearby green wall inserts a natural touch to the area. The greenery subtly leads on to a corridor, hinting at a unified design language throughout the office.

The open concept layout encompasses dedicated zones for workstations, communal spaces, work cafés and meeting rooms on all levels. Each zone is strategically planned to strike a balance between collaboration zones and quiet spaces for individuals.

A unique feature was the phone booth area's red/green light indicator on the



ceilings to signify availability. To enhance the user experience, the indicator is visible throughout the floor plate.

To suit the various demands of meetings and social activities in the communal areas and work cafés, the furniture was carefully selected to sport a bold interplay of vibrant colours, evoking a living room-like setting, distinguishing itself from the work areas.

The interiors are completed with IMMORTAL's Environmental Wayfinding solutions, designing distinctive signage to bolster navigation and familiarity, and cleverly applying the secondary corporate colours of the company to demarcate the quadrants of the offices on all floor plates.

Enhancing the firm's ethos of interacting with people, a customer-centric experience was conceptualised in the public-facing customer service area. The customer service team welcomes visitors, followed by consultants tending to customers. If needed, customers are chaperoned to a more private seating area, screened behind a refined combination of warm copper undertones and cool stainless steel along with a trim of gold accents.

Much thought was put into the plush waiting area. The seating can be configured

to form individual seats with a cocktail table, enabling the area to be repurposed as an event space.

An LG colour transparent LED screen faces the busy intersection outside, displaying engaging and vivid content. It blends into the glass walls, teasing passers-by with interactive and appealing contents to the financial solutions offered within.

The lobby on level one was refreshed for an updated look with a colour palette that complements the finishes with a hint of greenery, together with wayfinding elements that harmoniously enhance the functionality and aesthetic of the space.





Wisma Geylang Serai Singapore

Wisma Geylang Serai (WGS), nestled in the eastern region of the red dot, is Singapore's first-ever cultural heritage integrated hub, manifesting the government's intention to make the area more culturally distinctive and vibrant. Rankine&Hill was tasked to provide comprehensive MEP services, creating a platform to seamlessly integrate the project's architecture and landscape designs.



Key features at WGS are geared towards reduced energy consumption, including a chiller plant system (air conditioning) and LED lights. The objective was to integrate the architectural façade into the M&E design in order to provide the end-user with a forward-looking civic centre that is stylish and sophisticated on the inside, yet contemporary on the outside.

Engineers worked to carefully integrate the cooling towers and the chiller plant, concealing them from view to reduce obtrusiveness, with screening designed to improve the aesthetics of the building. It reflects a well-conceived M&E system that is not only effective, but that also took the overall objective of the project into consideration.

The Seletar and Ulu Pandan Bus Depots are the Land Transport Authorities' initiatives to provide adequate bus parking and maintenance services necessary for operation of new bus routes.

Transportation is essentially about the movement of people, and the design of the depots echoes this definition.

The depots are beautified by running an undulating linear ribbon window along the length of the entire façade. The variation in size and shape of the windows invoke a sense of change. In a design where form

follows function, visual interest is injected subtly where full-height windows are positioned for gathering spaces such as the canteen while smaller windows grant more privacy for offices and ops rooms. The change in window sizes and groove lines on the precast facade panels and perforated metal panels encapsulate the dynamic character of these bus depots.

Both depots feature a canteen, two-storey offices, refuelling and bus wash stations. In addition, rest areas have been designed for the bus captains to ensure they get the rest they need.



Masterplanning

Pamenang Highlands is nestled an hour's drive away from Surabaya and Juanda Airport. The location features a cool microclimate, being in close proximity to other highland features. Surrounded by nature, the plot is generally sheer, with a low population density.

An Agri-tourism Hub

The master plan envisions a day and night family integrated resort of 146 ha, owing to the precinct's rich Singosari and Majapahit history and cultures. In fact, the Surya Emblem, commonly found in the ruins around the site from the ancient Majapahit kingdom, is one of the main guiding principles behind the symbolic mandala. The concentric mandala features four tiers of influence, with purity at the centre. The proposal features a 5-star hotel and

villas to house visitors to two full-scale waterparks for families. With other venues such as an amphitheatre, cultural parks, a sunflower garden and agri-tourism farms, Pamenang Highlands is slated to become an irresistible attraction for family entertainment.

The master plan is interconnected with 3.7 kilometres of cable car ropeway with expansive views, with cable car stations on each of the four landmarks.

The four stations were designed with distinct concepts and programmes – A hilltop restaurant with a panoramic view, a treehouse, a horse-riding area connected to a garden and an observation tower overlooking the development.

Aside from daytime entertainment, the master plan will feature nine hectares of art, heritage and a mesmerising lighted park, around a pedestrian and cycling trail. This will open doors to collaboration with artists both local and global.

This entertainment and leisure master plan proves that developing for the future does not mean supplanting invaluable culture. All elements can thrive in harmony.

Masterplanning



This project brings us to the mountainous regions near the capital city of the Indonesian province, North Sulawesi, Manado. The country's ambitious vision for 2025 is to become the next tourist destination, as the new Bali and Lake Toba.

Asian tourists have already taken a keen interest to what this city has to offer, with snorkelling for lovers of the sea and other adventurous activities. The master plan has identified these trends, and will be focussing on the tourism/hospitality sector with a Tourism Triangle.

As the master plan is focussed outside of the city centre, it positions the development to be an integrated resort – a key destination of quality resorts and picturesque villas, boosting the tourism sector tremendously with various dining options and recreational facilities like farm-to-table experiences, spice gardens and more. This will generate local employment, boosting self-sufficiency.

Taking advantage of the panoramic seaview from the 139 ha site, the master plan will encompass hotels and villas with unobstructed views, away from bustling city, with a myriad of onsite resort amenities.

Swancity in Vietnam comprises Swanpark, the Garden Town and Swanbay, the Marina Villas. All areas feature their own unique landscape, appealing to a variety of demographics.

Swanpark

Envision a smart city where no expense has been spared on luscious greenery at every turn, with ample road accessibility and pathways, all connected by bridges across a flowing, meandering river. The largest green urban area in East Saigon is located in close proximity to the Long

Thanh International Airport and highways, and only half an hour's journey to the centre of Ho Chi Minh City.

The 945.1 ha development consists of an impressive 190 ha of trees and water, 28.3 ha of trade and services, 75.2 ha of public utilities, 197.7 ha of transport infrastructure, 85.3 ha of various community complexes and 364 ha of housing.

The master plan appeals to the urban sophisticate, with a wide variety of appealing home designs. For example, sector 1B, a subdivision of 28.3 ha, offers 360 modernist villas to keep on trend with affluent lifestyles. The villas differ slightly in layout, allowing buyers several configuration options.

The other amenities are truly extensive, with a hospital-grade healthcare service, 16 international standard schools covering the gamut of educational levels, a financial street, cinemas, restaurants, hotels and utility complexes matching international standards.

Swanbay

Northwest of Swanpark, along the Song Soai Rap (Saigon River) of Vietnam lies the

islet township of Swanbay. Nested on Dai Phuoc Island (Mr. Con Island), the "Pearl of the East of Saigon" spread across 464 hectares of the drop-shaped ait, providing geographical privacy and unique premium resort living. It is the only remaining island in Ho Chi Minh City, boosting the development's exclusivity.

Swanbay Urban Area boasts a 17% building density. Within that percentage is a riverside landscape park, a trade centre, a hospital, 5-star restaurants, sports centre, an 8-hole Jeongsan golf course and international schools.

The enclave epitomises exclusivity and grandeur; its massive scale is rendered possible through a well thought out master plan. This is modern high-end living to the letter – serene views of the landscape or a panorama of the surrounding river, optimal air quality standards and well-planned landscape integration for future use.

The homes and accompanying facilities all feature a tasteful French style of architecture. With the first phase offering 396 units varying in two- or three-level layouts, including the Grand Riverside, Riverfront, Garden, and duplex villas and town/houses. The second phase features 66 units of duplex and independent villas, while the third phase features 546 units of duplex, standard and riverside villas.

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Mapping out all essential requirements of a particular city, masterplanning needs to preserve or enhance the potential of the habitat. It will allow society to behave and thrive, focusing on key interests and needs. This was the intention underscoring Eco Sanctuary's masterplanning, ensuring a flourishing city that inhabitants can call home, amidst with a verdant haven.

With 308 acres of undulating land in the Klang Valley, the area in question is part of a larger master plan called Canal City. Predicated by its lush surroundings, the challenge was adhering to its land use, as Malaysia has a particular ratio for commercial/high rise or residential/land use. Another obstacle was the preservation of previously approved areas.

Taking into account of the city's vehicular usage, the master plan called for a relocation of the important parcels next to the external canal, resulting in more land parcels that could be utilised.

The individual parcels focused on density, depending on their housing types. This is essential, as varying parcels have differing needs. A linear park encourages young families to enjoy a green environment, eliminating the need to cross a road.

Myanmar is slated for strong economic growth, with Yangon flourishing as an industrial and transportation hub. In the next 10 years, the nation will see a paradigm shift from agriculture to value-added manufacturing and services.

Consistent improvement of infrastructure links along the north-south axis will be beneficial to the expected population shift to urban areas around Yangon, and in turn, ameliorate accessibility.

This developing economy will see a rising of the middle-class in Myanmar, who will demand more services and recreation, eventually leading to better quality healthcare, a rise in the tourism sector and potential for MICE.

The city will grow outwardly, and intensifying existing infrastructure. By 2040, improved accessibility will see Hlegu as a potential to gateway into Yangon from Naypyidaw and Mandalay. The changes could begin in the middle term (2020 to 2030) as eastern areas of the city develop with the increase in large-scale residential projects at the northern and eastern boundaries of the city.

The town of Hlegu is bound for densification of the city to the north-east. While the city has kept its industrial area intact, a potential green and recreational link could develop from the Hlwaga protected area to the site.

Its low propensity to flood compared to other areas provides opportunity for Hlegu to be utilised as a recreational area. In addition, public transportation networks currently under development from Hlegu and Yangon will strengthen this linkage and encourage growth across the YCDC's boundaries.

Hlegu's close proximity to the new international airport could make it attractive as a transit hub between Yangon and the rest of Myanmar.

Diligent masterplanning has retained hills to reduce earthwork, while aligning similar natural elevations to minimise slope runs and ensure soil stabilisation. Slopes were utilised to their own effect – a total of nine kilometres of linear embankments have been repurposed for marathon/ nature trails.

This could be divided into segments with community gardens as a counterpoint to the surrounding urban environment, with up to 3000 families nurturing their own piece of land.

In time, Yangon's need for R&D and educational spaces will be critical to its next stage of development, leading to clusters of innovation-driven businesses, hospitality, and green living.

Vis-à-vis United Nation's habitat recommendation ratio of 12 sqm per capita, the master plan exceeds with an impressive 40 sqm per capita.

This study resulted in an influx of ideas, including Hill Villas and a Discovery Zone for education. This includes proposing a Hill Top community park, nature reserves, boardwalks, edible gardens and bioswale.

DISRUPTIVE INNOVATION

A Modernist's Take on Evolution

Disruption in our past

Our high-tech era has taught industries to expect constant disruptive innovation. When companies fall behind expectations, consumers are quick to be judge, jury and executioner.

Consumers: fickle, relentless and unforgiving.

Nokia failed despite its pole position in the mobile market. The company, unfortunately, did not welcome the winds of change, and succumbed to the rise of the smartphone. There was a period of mourning, but also a learning point for the rest of the world.

Disruption may appear to be anathema to productivity, but the inverse is true relative to innovation; the act of identifying the problems of consumers, creating a new market and then displacing current structures, products and services actually raises overall productivity levels. Disruptive innovation has been altering the way we live since the 1500s — the Spice

Trade was disrupted by Frederick "Ice King" Tudor's Insulated Ice Warehouses. The Fridge disrupted this ice-cutting industry, and today, the domestic fridge is ubiquitous. But the telephone timeline might be more relevant to us: from Graham Bell/Elisha Grey's invention to the cordless phone in 1965, Motorola's wireless phone in 1973, Blackberry's email capability in 1999, Nokia's 3310 during the jubilee year and at last, the iPhone in 2007.

But disruption is more than a breakthrough innovation. It has a specific purpose, transforming a product that is inaccessible to one that is affordable for the rest of the world.

Experts claim "areas ripe for disruption today are no different to the areas that were ripe for disruption then". This puts disruption into the hands of creative individuals that can recognise the window of opportunity for improvement, and exploit it before others.

Applying this principle, we may ponder if the AEC (Architecture, Engineering and Construction) industry is ripe for disruption.

Disrupting the AEC industry

As with every theory, there are contextual issues with Disruptive Innovation. Journalists have claimed the term to be a massively overplayed idea, and an easily dependable ideological trope for the startup world.

But disruption is more than just golden ticket for innovators to dream. According to Clay Christensen, a Harvard School Professor renowned for his role as business consultant to Steve Jobs and Andrew Grove, disruption, as a business model, is more necessity than chance.

So what does Disruption have in store for our industry?

Architect Steven Burns aptly states, "... I think companies need to look at the tools on the horizon. It's not just adopting technologies, it's figuring out what to do with them." The registered Architect is also Chief Creative Officer at BQE Software, and a speaker for the upcoming AEC Next Conference and Expo.

This puts things into perspective. For the industry, it is more of an evolution than a revolution — making better tools and improving efficiency. Yet to be frank, when something truly disruptive comes up, the built environment community is usually inadequately prepared to demonstrate



its value to the client. This is our occupational hazard, and why it is imperative to be self-disruptors.

The CEO and Founder of Building System Planning Brett Young mentioned in the Thornton Tomasetti Annual report "Innovations in existence allows us to track every element that is made while building a project. That big data allows us to ensure a building goes together succinctly. But when we add automation, it can tell us who has made a big improvement, or a redundant one. That will definitely change the way we work."

It offers you the agility to disrupt, helping you shatter your own limitations and define your own innovation.

Disruption is more than just golden ticket for innovators.

Technology is coming to the AEC industry by storm: site, bridge, and façade surveys are being conducted by drones. 3D scanning is developing point clouds that create accurate building models. Autonomous construction vehicles are being produced in greater numbers — dump trucks, front-loaders, etc. Wearable technology is entering the job site via smart watches and hardhats with computer screens built into their visors. Augmented reality and virtual reality are providing more precise information than ever before.

Round the corner

Project Quantum from Autodesk is using a cloud-based, single source of data, for all contributors to utilise. But they are continuing to develop automation and even artificial intelligence, towards generative design — users input the components and limitations into the software, and leave it to the program to churn out a plethora of options.

Tom Traina, Business Technology Strategist in the AEC Industry has the same sentiment, "The opportunity still lies in the execution of the designs, the construction. How can these technologies contribute to the construction of the project? The best design is only as good as its execution or construction. Centralising the information is a great start, and the disruptive technologies allow users to reference and retrieve the information important to them on their own terms. No one controls how the information provided will be used. But the firms that figure this out become the new winners — and when you displace the incumbent, you become the disruptor. These technologies allow disruptors to cut corners for efficiency and deliver on the job to be done."

Essentially, technology provides us with the skeleton key, but we have to choose which doors to open. We have to elevate our thinking, disrupt the traditional way we do things, and **change our mindsets**.

The word 'agility' gets bounced around ever so often, but it is imperative for survival. Take a look at how the past focus was based on manufacturing capacity, speed and efficiency. Now, the future focus is based on capability, where each headcount is valued for several, and not just a singular purpose.

To summarise, the technologies we have been craving for in the AEC industry are already on the horizon. In fact, the fine-tuning is already in process. And when they do arrive, we should be ready to embrace them.


